

West Virginia Forward, led by experts from all three entities, works to develop initiatives from all sectors of the economy and to dissolve any obstacles or boundaries that may hinder investigation and innovation. Another exciting program hosted by the Alliance is the annual state update and professional development conference, dubbed "Small Communities, BIG Solutions," because it celebrates what is working well across our state. During the 25+ hours of programming, attendees heard from Tourism Secretary Chelsea Ruby, along with an expert panel on outdoor business opportunities for West Virginia, to help communities and budding entrepreneurs see possibilities for outdoor recreation growth.

From initiatives like our Robert C. Byrd Institute's product development – fishing lures and kayaking anchors – to economic impact studies by the Center for Business and Economic Research, Marshall University is committed to local job growth and economic development. It is not enough to give lip service to collaboration. We must commit time, talent and resources to working together to move West Virginia forward.

One of Marshall's most successful alumni, former Intuit CEO Brad Smith, understands the significance of collaboration to achieve goals. He pitches in wherever and whenever help is needed in his home state. Brad is recognized and respected throughout our country's business community, even being named to Forbes' 10 Influential American Business Leaders in 2017.
