Nucor's new \$3.1 billion sheet steel mill, which recently broke ground in Mason County, will produce the lowest embodied carbon steel in the world, and it will be 100% recyclable. Perhaps even more impressive is Nucor's ranking as the Most Admired Steel Company in the U.S., with an employee retention of more than 90%. Fidelis New Energy, which is also coming to Mason County, will construct a modern facility that will produce clean hydrogen and so much more. The three pillars of their facility will represent an investment of over \$6 billion that will bolster West Virginia's contribution to an American clean energy future. BHE Renewables, which will locate on the former Century Aluminum site in Jackson County, West Virginia, plans to build a first-of-itskind microgrid, powered by renewable energy resources. This project will also house Precision Castparts, who will build a titanium melt facility, and Our Next Energy (ONE), an energy storage company that will store and manufacture batteries on site. All of these ventures represent new cutting-edge projects that make our future very bright.

In order to ensure the success of these companies and their projects, our local economic development entities, convention bureaus, industry associations and education systems have embraced these projects and are working hard to provide local support and community involvement. It is critical that we support these projects and provide the proper amenities, housing, education, encouragement, and employees that will be needed to ensure a long and prosperous future for these ventures, our citizens, and our region.

Once you read this issue, I am sure you will agree that these are indeed very exciting times for our region and the new pioneers of the Ohio River Valley. V
