Growing a Culture of Health

C. Donovan Beckett, D.O., attended the West Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine and completed a family medicine residency program at Charleston Area Medical Center, a West Virginia University affiliate in Charleston, West Virginia.

In 2004, he opened Comprehensive Health Solutions, a private practice. He has previously served as chief of staff at Williamson Memorial Hospital and is the physician founder of the Williamson Health and Wellness Center, a Federally Qualified Health Center. He also established the Health Innovation Hub as a local resource center in Williamson.

Beckett advocated for collaboration between health care and emerging sectors as the chairman of the West Virginia Rural Health Conference, "Mountains of Innovation," in 2016. He devotes his time to social enterprise development and community revitalization.

Williamson Health and Wellness Center provides clinical care to a coal-producing area, where our primary industry has recently taken a major dive. In the past four years, Mingo County lost more than 2,000 jobs, impacting more than 25 percent of the workforce for an area already struggling with low employment rates. On top of that, the community continues to battle some of the highest rates of obesity, diabetes, hypertension and opioid abuse in the country.

With coal prices dropping and mine companies pulling back, there is an ever-pressing need to address community issues creatively. It is up to us to think about ways to leverage diverse investments and to focus on the development of enterprise with recoverable value in our communities as a pathway forward.

This summer, Williamson Health and Wellness Center partnered with Impact Experience to bring together 22 cross-sector leaders from across the nation with the purpose of accelerating Williamson's leadership and to begin building toward a diversified and sustainable economy. Ray Daffner of the Appalachian Regional Commission described the experience as, "a chance to showcase innovative ideas and to hear from innovative experts about solutions."

Impact investor Daryn Dodson led the discussion by asking the question: "How do we reimagine, and innovate, with the people in the community and the innovators who have come here with this purpose in mind – all working together to create a new future?"

We have a strong and connected community here, and during hard times, everyone works to keep that sense of community and belonging intact. We really try to focus on building solutions. Our aim is to improve the health outcomes of patients and to simultaneously address the diverse social determinants of health.

We are helping to carve out the crosswalk that connects tourism, agriculture and health care sectors, utilizing revenue generated from the clinic and outside investment to rejuvenate Williamson's downtown spaces and prepare for new business leaders to emerge.
